- Color differences between production lots of fabric, sling, or spunpoly compared to samples or previously
 produced items

Powder coated aluminium

- Clean easily with a sponge and clean water.
- For stubborn dirt, use mild soap or dishwashing liquid with a soft-bristle brush.
- Avoid strong detergents or scouring agents.
- Rusty condensate running out of furniture tubes is normal: remove the end caps, allow to dry, spray corrosion
 inhibitor, and replace the caps.
- Light surface scratches over time are normal the coating still protects the metal. Use car polish to make scratches less visible.

Rope

PP Rope (Polypropylene Rope)

- Prepare a mild soapy water solution.
- Clean gently: Use a sponge or very soft-bristle brush to lightly scrub the surface.
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- Blot excess moisture with a clean, soft towel or sponge.
- Wet vacuum or repeat blotting to remove excess water.
- Repeat as needed until the stain is gone.
- Extra tip: PP rope is more porous than PVC and can hold moisture, so ensure thorough drying to prevent mildew.

PVC Rope (Polyvinyl Chloride Rope)

- Prepare a mild soapy water solution.
- Wipe rather than scrub: PVC rope has a smoother, less absorbent surface, so wiping with a sponge is usually enough.
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- Blot excess moisture with a clean, soft towel or sponge (dries faster than PP).
- Repeat as needed until the stain is gone.
- Extra tip: PVC rope is less prone to absorbing liquids but can scratch if scrubbed too hard, so always use soft materials.

Key differences:

PP Rope: Slightly softer, more porous, needs careful drying and can tolerate gentle scrubbing.

PVC Rope: Smoother, less absorbent, cleans easily with wiping but should avoid abrasive scrubbing.

Fabric

Olefin Fabric (Solution-Dyed Polypropylene)

- Brush off loose dirt first.
- Cleaning solution: 1/4 cup (62.5 ml) mild soap per 4 liters (16 cups) of lukewarm water (below 38°C).
- Clean gently: Use a soft cloth or sponge (olefin is less absorbent and releases dirt easily).
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- Allow to air dry.
- Generally resists fading and moisture, so retreatment is rarely needed.
- Parasols or cushions can be rinsed with a hose while still on the frame and left open to dry.

Acrylic Dyed Fabric (Solution-Dyed Acrylic)

- Brush off loose dirt first.
- Cleaning solution: Same ratio (1/4 cup mild soap per 4 liters lukewarm water).
- Clean with a soft-bristle brush (acrylic fibers can hold onto dirt more than olefin, so light brushing helps).
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- Allow to air dry.
- May require retreatment (with a fabric protector) over time to maintain water repellency.
- Parasols can be rinsed with a hose while still on the frame and left open to dry.

Key differences:

Olefin: Lower water absorption, faster drying, better chemical resistance, typically no retreatment.

Acrylic: Softer hand feel, slightly more absorbent, may need water-repellent retreatment after a few seasons.

Sling (plastci mesh)

- Wipe with soapy water and dry with a soft cloth.
- Never use cleaners containing solvents, as they can damage the surface finish.
- Protect against UV damage to extend the life of the fabric store indoors during winter or use a sunshade/cover when not in use.

Wicker (synthetic weave)

- Wipe with a damp cloth and mild soap.
- For deeper cleaning, use a wicker cleaner and a soft/medium brush.

Tops

Aluminium Tops

- Cleaning: Wipe regularly with a soft cloth and clean water.
- Stubborn dirt: Use mild soap or dishwashing liquid with a soft sponge or cloth.
- Avoid: Harsh abrasives, scouring pads, or highly alkaline/acidic cleaners that can damage the powder coating.
- Tip: Rinse thoroughly and dry to prevent water spots.

Ceramic Tops

- Cleaning: Use a soft cloth or sponge with mild soap and warm water.
- Avoid: Abrasive powders, metal brushes, or acid-based cleaners that may etch or dull the surface.
- Stains: For stubborn marks, use a pH-neutral cleaner or diluted baking soda paste.
- Tip: Wipe up spills quickly (especially oils, wine, or acidic liquids) to prevent staining.

Synthetic Stone Tops (e.g., Composite Stone / Sintered Stone)

- Cleaning: Mild soap and warm water with a soft cloth.
- Avoid: Highly acidic or alkaline cleaners; scouring pads may scratch the surface.
- Tip: Use coasters and placemats to protect from scratches or discoloration over time.
- Maintenance: Usually no sealing required, but check manufacturer's guidelines.

Natural Wood Tops (e.g., Teak, Iroko)

- Cleaning: Brush off dust and clean with mild soap and water using a soft brush.
- Maintenance: Wood weathers naturally to a silvery grey. Apply teak oil or wood sealer periodically if you wish to maintain the original color.
- Tip: Store indoors or cover during heavy rain to extend life; always allow wood to dry fully before covering.
- Avoid: Harsh chemical cleaners or pressure washing.

Synthetic Wood Tops (e.g., Polywood, WPC)

- Cleaning: Wash with mild soap and water using a soft sponge or cloth.
- Avoid: Abrasive pads or harsh solvents.
- Tip: Synthetic wood is low-maintenance no oiling or sealing required.
- Stains: For stubborn marks, use a soft-bristle brush with mild soap, then rinse thoroughly.
